Oklahoma's Promise offers qualified Oklahoma students an opportunity to earn money to help with their postsecondary education. The Oklahoma's Promise scholarship program allows eligible 8th, 9th, 10th and 11th grade students, who meet certain income, academic and conduct requirements, to receive a college or technology center tuition scholarship. These scholarships can be used at accredited public or private colleges or universities in Oklahoma and for a limited number of programs and courses at public technology centers within the state.
